

How can you get your own Free copy of Logo?

Logo, the programming environment, is what is we call share-ware or free-ware, which means it is a program that is distributed free of charge over the internet. So, if you have a computer with access to the internet you can have your own copy of Logo at home!

The official site for information about Logo on the web is The Logo Foundation's site, which is run by the MIT Media Lab. That URL is:

From this site we found a link to download the version of Logo you have been using at Artemis. To download your own copy all you need to do is follow the steps listed below:

1) Open the following URL in a web browser:

<http://www.softronix.com/logo.html>

2) Click on the second link under the heading "MSW Logo Release Kits." The link is labeled "Win32 Kit : Complete installation kit for Windows NT/95/98"

3) A dialogue box will appear and ask you if you want to Open or Save this program. You should select the button for "Save this program to disk" and then click OK. It will then download the install kit onto your machine.

3) A second dialogue box will appear and ask you where you want to save your new copy of Logo. The desktop is a good option, because it will be easy to find later :)

- 4) When the next dialogue box appears, click close. Then close your internet browser.
- 5) Now you need to find the new icon you just created. If you saved to the desktop it will be on the desktop (if you saved elsewhere, you will have to open that folder to find the icon.) The icon will look like a small monitor and will be labeled “msw32b64” Click on it to open.
- 6) An install wizard will appear with a series of instructions. Follow them to install your new program. Once you are done you will have a complete copy of Logo which you can use with the programs you saved in this book. You can also write new and more interesting programs. If you have any questions or can't remember something, the Index which is in the Help menu of Logo is quite thorough and helpful. There are also hundreds of online guides and tutorials that you can find using your friend Google.
