We are including these essay questions because we want to know more about you, your interests, and your ambitions. Please choose two questions and answer each one on a separate sheet of paper. Again, these should be typed (double-spaced) or neatly written. Your answers should be about a page long for each question.

1. You have just been hired by the Brown Invention Department! Congrats! They want you to create an invention to help address problems that people face. This could range from an everyday problem to one on a global scale. Describe why the problem you want to solve is important to you, what your invention is and how it will work, and how it will target the problem effectively.
2. Tell us about a particular homework assignment, project, paper, or production you have worked on that means something to you. What made it important or worthwhile for you? Did you work alone or with a group, and what responsibilities did you have? Did any challenges come up along the way, and if so, how did you resolve them?
3. A lot of different people are involved in producing a daily newspaper. For example, writers, photographers, editors, artists, advertisers, and many, many more... Suppose you were working on a major paper like the Boston Globe or the Providence Journal. What position would you choose, and why? Feel free to choose any of the ones we mentioned above, or to find out about any other jobs that are part of creating a newspaper.
